Kate Blackmore is a Sydney-based documentary filmmaker whose work has been presented across cinematic, broadcast and contemporary art contexts. She has written, directed and produced over 25 short arts documentaries for the Australian Broadcasting Corporation (ABC), including the Walkley Award nominated series *The Movement*. In 2018, Blackmore was awarded the Hive commission to create *The Woman and The Car*, a hybrid documentary about iconic Australian artist Margaret Dodd. The film was produced by Bridget Ikin (Felix Media) and financed by Adelaide Film Festival, Screen Australia and the ABC. In 2022, Blackmore began pre-production on her debut feature documentary, *Make it Look Real*, supported by Screen Australia, Create NSW and the SAFC. Blackmore is also a founding member of the acclaimed Australian artist collective <u>Barbara Cleveland</u>.
